4 Finance report - Ref: 411

6 Haywain - Ref: 414

The group had been offered a Hay Wain by Habrough In Bloom and it was agreed to accept the gift which would require some work. Chris Dunn offered to store the hay wain on his drive until the work had been completed. The chair thanked him for this offer. It was agreed to locate the Hay Wain where the old re-cycle bins were located.

7 Bike rubbing and painting - Ref: 420

Two bikes had been obtained which required rubbing down and painting. It was suggested to paint one red and site near the kissing gate on Station Road and the second to be painted black and located outside the Old Police House on Woad Lane.

8 Benches to be wiped down and re-oiled - Ref: 421

It was suggested the the benches located throughout the village be cleaned and painted as necessary together with the wooen planters.

<u>9</u> Boxes on Herbert Rollet Way - Ref: 425

It was suggested to place 4 additional metal planters along Herbert Rollett way. This was approved although concern was raised at watering the plants. This area also required weeding prior to summer cutting.
