c) Great Coates in Bloom Committee - Ref: 1814

Cllr Dunn read a report detailing the East Midlands in Bloom judging day and how the group was engaging more with the community. He reported that an anonymous passer-by had given a £100 cash donation to the group. Thanks went to all volunteers of the group for sterling efforts in watering and preparation prior to the EMIB judging. Particular thanks were given to Cllr Mike Stewart, Chair of the committee, and Carl Thomas for organising the judging and production of the portfolio.

a) Village Council Magazine - Ref: 1816

Both the editor and Clerk had had personal issues in June resulting in the magazine production being delayed. It was agreed to cancel the June magazine.

b) Installation of outside tap at hall - Ref: 1817

It was resolved to install a 25mm outside tap linked direct into the water main up to a maximum of £1000.

c) Village Hall hire - Ref: 1818

The Clerk advised councillors The Venue in the Village is nearing capacity and several requests to hire concurrently on a Wednesday evening had been declined owing to an existing booking on the last Wednesday of each month. In order to maximise revenue and widen the community benefit, the Clerk made communication with the current hirer of the last Wednesday of each month asking if they could move their hire to a Thursday evening for the reasons given above. This request was subsequently rejected.

Whilst councillors noted the good work this group had done, regarding the community and charity fundraising, they formally recognised their duty to maximise income from The Venue in the Village (potentially lowering the village precept) and appeal to the wider community through more varied activities and events at The Venue in the Village. Councillors considered various other alternatives to accommodate as many hirers as possible.

It was resolved to:

1. Only take midweek, single bookings on Thursdays, which must be booked and paid for in accordance with the existing terms of 6 weeks. A single booking would be defined as one not being repeated within 7 days of a previous booking by the same person / group.
2. Cancel the existing, single, Wednesday booking and offer the present hirer the available Thursday evenings as a direct replacement.
3. Amend the terms and conditions of hire allowing the Council to cancel a regular booking providing a minimum two months' notice.
