1975 - Newbury Avenue Garages

The NELC Officer is progressing the state of the garages and progress had been made. There are a number of issues as the land is privately owned and the ownership of some garages is proving problematic.

5801 - Hall Improvements : Remainder of Hall Painting

5804 - Hall Improvements : Exterior Wood Panels

5805 - Hall Grounds : Ornamental tree & Tree Guards

7267 - FP49 Motorbikes

A resident had recently provided CCTV which was passed to the Police and has assisted in identifying some of the riders. Additional resources were being deployed by the Police including four additional officers and use of the fire brigade drone to tackle the problem which is across the whole borough and not just Great Coates.

8381 - Steam Cleaner

Demonstration of the cleaner would be undertaken shortly.

8563 - HGVs In Village

NELC had confirmed that no junction changes of Woad Lane / Estate Rd No 5 would take place at this time. Additional, permanent signage was being presently investigated.

Results of the speed survey in October had been received which showed, over a 7 day average:-

Woad Lane is 48th in regards to safety from an accident perspective

Woad Lane averaged 4489 vehicles travelling at 28.3 mph with 8.5% exceeding 35 mph.
Station Road averaged 5206 vehicles travelling at 29.4 mph with 7.8% exceeding 35 mph

14070 - Cooks Lane

A complaint had been received regarding the pot holes and condition of Cooks Lane. The day of the report road engineers did visit and it had been reported the pot holes had been filled in on 26th January.
